Neither of us are officially trained yet, but we have lots of contacts we can go to and try to get you answers.

We have Applications for Admission to a PA State Veterans' Home. I know this is a last resort for everyone, but as we age and are left to fend for ourselves this might be an option that everyone wants to keep in their back pocket! Contact me if you want to fill one out or know of someone who needs to take advantage of this benefit.

American Legion Heroes! If you've heard of the Hometown Heroes Program, then you'll know what I'm talking about when I tell you that we are going to start hanging banners from the light poles on our property for those Legionnaires that no longer live near their hometowns. The same company that puts together the banners for the Hatfield and Lansdale Hometown Heroes Program has agreed to make banners for us that will say American Legion in the place of the hometown. They

will cost the same as the Hatfield and Lansdale banners at \$130 each. Please see the attached flyer and fill out the application form, there will also be packets printed and placed in the foyer of the post, if you're interested and still have questions, please contact Ann Scheuring at heroes@verizon.net. Do you know the widow of a Navy Vietnam Veteran? If the Veteran served in the Republic of Vietnam or on a vessel operating not more than 12 nautical miles off the shore of Vietnam or Cambodia between January 9th 1962, and May 7th 1975, then they may be eligible for Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC). DIC is a benefit paid by the USDVA and includes monthly compensation and Healthcare coverage.

Also, this one's important, Montgomery County has rental assistance money available for Veterans, call 211 and ask for rental assistance through the Montgomery County ERUC "Your Way Home". They can give up to 15 months of rental assistance money! They have

money that they have to use, or it goes back to the state! Take advantage of this valuable benefit!!

We will continue to announce that Post 933 has 15 burial plots remaining in Whitemarsh Memorial Park (WMP) for the use of our Veterans. If you'd like to learn more about these plots and get an estimate for how much burial in the WMP might cost, please reach out to Tom Harwick or myself. Unfortunately, these plots will be given away on a "first come, first serve" basis.
